GETTING STARTED ON BECOMING A C.A.R. MEMBER

ELIGIBILITY

Any young person under the age of twenty-one is eligible for membership in the National Society of the Children of the American Revolution. The prospective member must be lineally descended from a man or woman who, with unflinching loyalty, rendered material aid to the cause of American Independence as a soldier, sailor, civil officer, or recognized patriot in one of the several Colonies or States, or of the United States. The prospective member must also be personally acceptable to the respective society.

2. You may obtain the application paper from National Headquarters or the Society President.
3. Completely fill out C.A.R.'s application on (100% cotton, acid-free paper on 8 ½ x 14)
4. The Senior Society President must sign the application before submitting to headquarters
 - a. If the prospective member is joining a particular society in his/her State
5. The Senior State President must sign the application before submitting to headquarters
 - a. If the prospective member is joining as member "At-Large"
6. Application processing fee is **\$15.00 plus** the National Dues (**\$20.00**). Therefore, the total is \$35.00 for the 1st child and \$30.00 for the 2nd or subsequent child, using the same mother, father and revolutionary ancestor. Check made payable to N.S.C.A.R.
